I was honored to be one of the 12 Charter members of the OD Shag Club; was invited to be a board member of the National Shag Dance Committee, on which I still serve.; was in the room at the State House when Governor Dick Riley signed the bill that made The Shag our state dance. I watched and learned from the legends before SPA that are the body and soul of the Hall of Fame. I lived through the dormant period on the beach when there was only Donnie's and The Spanish Galleon; I watched ecstatically as shag was resurrected at Fat Jack's, Harold's Across the Street and Ducks.
